<p>My experience with learning poker through the limits has been this:</p><p>at every level, you</p><p> learn something new</p><p>At first, you don't 6 , £ know why it works... but you do know THAT</p><p>it</p><p> works. For example, how much to value bet.</p><p>Then you start 6 , £ to realize other people at</p><p> that level are using that trick and how to exploit it... why it's</p><p> working, how 6 , £ it</p><p> works... the math behind it... and just every little thing.</p><p>When you see some guy</p><p> floating another guy on 2 6 , £ streets and then shoving his entire stack on the river... why</p><p> is he doing that? Did some kinda random draw 6 , £ come in and he's</p><p> hoping for a call? Is the</p><p> first guy really aggressive, does he have a low showdown 6 , £ percent?</p><p> Is it some kind of</p><p> combination of all of the above?</p><p>Is his bet when lead turn % 85?</p><p>What do 6 , £ those 's even</p><p> mean at that limit?</p><p>Pretty much, high-stakes pros aren't high stakes pros because they</p><p> know fancy moves. They're 6 , £ pros because they understand those</p><p> "fancy" moves. FOR THE</p><p> MOST PART I think even high stakes pros value just solid 6 , £ steady play. For them, the</p><p> more simple they can keep their actions the more eV their actions are.</p><p></p><p>That being said,</p><p> 6 , £ their simple actions are very complex... but things like 4-bet shoving loose 3-bettors</p><p> with ATC is a very valueable play. 6 , £ These plays work because they understand that their</p><p> opponents see the stats they have... that they can't put them on 6 , £ a bluff and because</p><p> the chance that the 3-bettor has a bad hand is a very likely.</p><p></p><p>If for some reason,</p><p> 6 , £ people @100NL don't like folding to their 4-bet shoves when they have low suited</p><p> connectors... they're going to figure this 6 , £ out and say "well, there's no point in</p><p> 4-betting this guy because he's going to call with his JTos and 6 , £ be a favorite." The</p><p> other thing you need to realize if that's the case is that they's
