Tocantins Esporte Clube, commonly referred to as Tocantins, is a Brazilian professional club based in Tocantins, Tocantins founded on 1 January 1989. It competes in the Campeonato Brasileiro Srie D, the fourth tier of Brazilian football, as well as in the Campeonato Tocantinense, the top flight of the Tocantins state football league.

Tocantins is the second-best ranked team from Tocantins in CBF's national club ranking, being placed 146th overall.[1]

History [edit]

The club was founded on January 1, 1989.[2] They competed for the first time in the Srie C in 1997, when they were eliminated in the Second Stage of the competition. The club won the Campeonato Tocantinense in 1993 and in 2002.[2] They competed once in the Srie A in 2000, the competition was named Copa Joao Havelange at the time, and they reached the Second Stage of the Copa Joao Havelange Group Green and White. The club competed again the Srie C in 2002, when they were eliminated in the Second Stage by Nacional.

They competed in the Copa do Brasil in 2003, when they were eliminated in the First Round by Vitria. Tocantins was eliminated in the First Stage in the 2005 by Remo.

Stadium [edit]

Tocantins play their home games at Ribeirao. The stadium has a maximum capacity of 8,000 people.[3]
