The Hungary Euro 2024 odds reflect the fact that the Magyars must compete in the 'group of death' alongside holders Portugal, World Cup winners France and perennial powerhouses Germany. Getting out of such a tough section is asking an awful lot of a team which finished only fourth in their qualifying pool behind Croatia, Wales and Slovakia. Marco Rossi's men impressed during the play-offs, though, winning 3-1 in Bulgaria before edging out Iceland 2-1 on home turf, despite the head coach being absent due to a positive coronavirus test. Hungary battled through to the last 16 five years ago before having their limitations exposed in a 4-0 drubbing by Belgium. However, successive promotions in the Nations League suggest this is a progressive outfit, with Russia, Serbia and Turkey behind them in a B-level group last year. Veteran captain Adam Szalai likes to lead from the front, while Nemanja Nikolic is another experienced forward, but question marks have to be raised regarding the overall quality of this squad, especially given such a daunting schedule.
